INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (ICE)

To qualify for an ICE a candidate must obtain at least grade G(g) at International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) or at least grade E(e) at General Certificate of Education Ordinary Level (GCE O Level) in each of seven syllabuses, six of which must be IGCSE syllabuses. These must include two syllabuses from Group 1 (Languages) and at least one syllabus from each of Groups 2 (Humanities), 3 (Sciences), 4 (Mathematics) and 5 (Professional and Creative).

ICE is awarded in three categories:

Distinction where a candidate obtains grade A(a) or above in five syllabuses and grade C(c) or above in two further syllabuses.

Merit where a candidate obtains grade C(c) or above in five syllabuses and grade F(f) or above in two further syllabuses.

Pass where a candidate obtains grade G(g) or above in seven syllabuses.

A candidate's individual syllabus grades are reported separately on IGCSE and GCE certificates as follows:

INTERNATIONAL GENERAL CERTIFICATE OF SECONDARY EDUCATION (IGCSE)

IGCSE grades A*(a*), A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), F(f) or G(g) indicate the standard reached, grade A*(a*) being the highest and grade G(g) the lowest. Performances below the standard of grade G(g) are not reported on certificates.

GCE ORDINARY LEVEL (GCE O Level)

GCE O Level grades $A^*(a^*)$, A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d) or E(e) indicate the standard reached, grade $A^*(a^*)$ being the highest and grade E(e) the lowest. Performances below the standard of grade E(e) are not reported on certificates.

PRIVATE CANDIDATES

For private candidates the centre name is not reported on certificates.

CONDITIONS OF ISSUE
