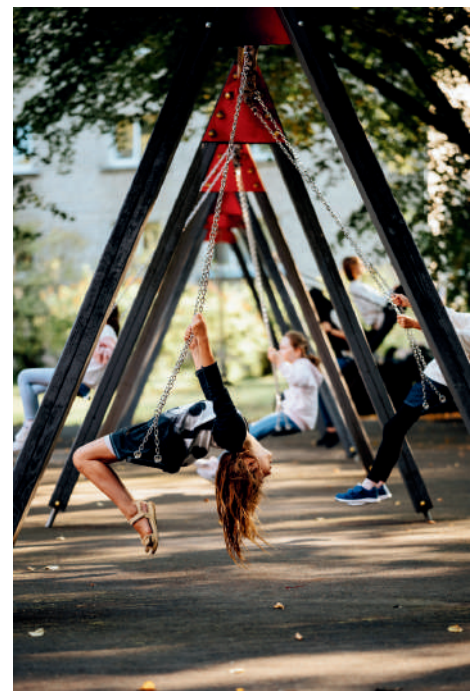

# Early Years at ISR

Where Curiosity Blossoms and Confidence Grows

We believe that a child's early years lay the foundation for a lifetime of learning. Our Early Years programme, for children aged **2** to **6**, is thoughtfully designed to nurture independence, creativity, and a deep love of discovery.

In our **welcoming, home-like environment**, children are encouraged to **explore, ask questions**, and follow their **natural curiosity**. We embrace **play-based, inquiry-driven** learning inspired by the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP), helping even our youngest learners begin developing the skills, attitudes, and confidence they need to thrive.



At ISR, our learning environments encourage collaboration and peer learning, with educators guiding each child with care and intention. Classrooms are filled with open-ended materials and "loose parts" that spark **creativity, imagination, and sensory play**.

We nurture independence from the very beginning. Children learn to build routines, make choices, and care for their environment, gaining valuable life skills and growing in confidence along the way.

Starting school is a big step for children and parents. That's why we create a caring, supportive atmosphere where young learners feel safe and empowered. Our experienced educators focus on each child's emotional and academic development, maintaining strong communication with families through weekly updates, the Toddle platform, and student-led conferences.

Together, we make the early years a positive and successful start to school life.

## OUR CURRICULUM

### Learning Through Play

Rooted in the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP), our approach blends purposeful play with inquiry-based learning. Children explore concepts through hands-on experiences, storytime, sensory play, movement, and nature.

Classrooms are filled with open-ended materials and “loose parts” to inspire creativity and imagination.

### Language Development

- English is the language of instruction.
- For non-native speakers, EAL (English as an Additional Language) support is available.
- Latvian and French are introduced through music, storytelling, and play.

Children are grouped by developmental needs and learning stage—not strictly by age—ensuring they feel confident and supported

### Forest Program

Early Years children regularly visit nearby forests to explore the natural world. These lessons build motor skills, social-emotional resilience, and a strong connection to Latvia’s rich environment.

### Social-Emotional Growth

We guide each child to develop independence, empathy, and self-regulation. Children learn to make choices, take care of their belongings, and build routines. Our School Counselor and nurturing teachers support emotional wellbeing every step of the way.

## IB PYP at ISR

Inspiring Young Minds Through Inquiry, Exploration, and Global Understanding

Our Primary Years Programme (PYP) offers a dynamic and engaging educational experience for students aged **6 to 11**. As an authorized International Baccalaureate (IB) World School since 2005, we are committed to fostering intellectual, personal, emotional, and social growth in our students.

### What is the IB PYP?

The IB PYP is a comprehensive international curriculum that takes a holistic approach to education, aiming to develop inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring young people. It encourages students to become active, compassionate, and lifelong learners who appreciate diverse perspectives. At ISR, we emphasize student agency, empowering learners to have a voice, make choices, and take ownership of their educational journey.

### Our Approach to Learning

At the heart of our PYP is inquiry-based learning, where students actively engage in exploring concepts and ideas. This approach nurtures critical thinking and problem-solving skills, encouraging students to ask questions and seek answers through investigation. Our diverse community, comprising 47 nationalities, enriches the learning environment, allowing students to gain global perspectives and develop intercultural understanding. Students are guided by the principles of the IB PYP and the attributes of the Learner Profile, developing into thoughtful, curious, and internationally minded individuals.

### Curriculum

Our curriculum encompasses a broad range of subjects, including languages (English, French, Latvian), mathematics, visual arts, science, music, physical education, and social studies. We have developed our own Programme of Inquiry and Scope & Sequence documents to ensure a coherent and comprehensive learning experience. Recognizing that many of our students are non-native English speakers, we have established robust support systems to help them acquire proficiency in English, the language of instruction, as swiftly as possible.

### A Curriculum That Connects

The curriculum is built around six transdisciplinary themes that connect subjects like:

- Mathematics
- English Language Arts
- Science
- Social Studies
- Arts
- Physical Education

### Languages We Offer

We value multilingualism and cultural diversity. Each child receives 4 language lessons per week, grouped by language needs:

- Latvian (native or foreign)
- French
- EAL (English as an Additional Language) for non-native speakers

Students learning French also receive one Latvian lesson per week—and vice versa.

### Supporting Every Learner

We believe every child deserves the right to thrive.

- Our SEN Coordinator works with classroom teachers and families to ensure needs are met.
- Our School Counselor supports emotional wellbeing and social skills development.

ISR emphasizes both academic progress and personal growth—so students are prepared for life, not just tests.

### Assessment & Feedback

We guide progress through thoughtful, age-appropriate assessment methods:

- Ongoing classroom assessment
- MAP Testing (Grades 2–5) in Math, Reading, Language, and Science
- Biannual written reports
- Student-led conferences where children reflect on their learning with pride

- Field Trips that bring learning to life (including optional overnight trips)
- Assemblies and student presentations to build confidence
- Castle House Competitions that build teamwork and school spirit

# IB MYP at ISR

## What is the IB MYP?

The Middle Years Programme is an educational framework designed for students **aged 11-16**, which encourages students to make practical connections between their studies and the real world, fostering **critical thinking, creativity, and global awareness**. It emphasizes a balanced education integrating traditional subjects with interdisciplinary learning, ensuring students understand how knowledge and skills connect across disciplines.

### Our Approach to Learning

At ISR, the IB MYP (Candidacy Phase) was chosen as the Middle School curriculum because we believe it offers a dynamic and challenging education that empowers students to think independently, learn collaboratively, and make meaningful contributions to their communities and the world. It also bridges the needs of the adolescent brain with the preparations and academic rigors required to prepare them for the IB Diploma Programme.

### The MYP Curriculum

Each year, students in the MYP engage in at least one collaboratively planned interdisciplinary unit that involves at least two subject groups. In the final year of the MYP, students undertake a personal project that reflects their interests and demonstrates their skills at the culmination of the program. It enables students to showcase their learning through inquiry in a way that is intentional and shared with our community in a meaningful way.

### Global Contexts

Students learn best when their learning experiences have context and are connected to their lives and their experience of the world that they have experienced. Using global contexts, MYP students develop an understanding of their common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet through developmentally appropriate explorations of identities and relationships, personal and cultural expression orientations in space and time, scientific and technical innovation, fairness and development, globalization, and sustainability.



## Middle Years Programme (MYP) at ISR

Grades 6–10

### Learning That Matters

In the MYP, students explore subjects not in isolation, but as part of a bigger picture. They connect knowledge across disciplines, reflect on their learning, and apply it to real-world issues. Whether investigating human rights in Humanities, designing solutions in STEM, or expressing themselves through the arts, students are encouraged to think critically and creatively every step of the way.

### Thinking Beyond the Classroom

Every unit in the MYP is grounded in a global context—helping students understand not just what they're learning, but why it matters. They examine themes like identity, sustainability, fairness, and innovation, preparing them to become thoughtful, globally-minded individuals.

As part of their development, students also participate in meaningful service learning. Through community action, they learn to lead with empathy and responsibility.

### Personal Project – A Milestone Moment

In **Grade 10**, each student embarks on the Personal Project—a self-directed journey into a topic or passion of their choice. They research, plan, create, and reflect on their own timeline, showcasing the independence and skills they've developed throughout the programme.

It's a rite of passage—and a powerful celebration of student voice, agency, and purpose.

### Assessment & Support

Our approach to assessment focuses on growth, not grades. Students receive ongoing feedback based on IB criteria, helping them understand where they are, where they're going, and how to get there.

Alongside academic development, we support the whole student. Our Advisory programme nurtures wellbeing and goal-setting, while a dedicated school counselor and learning support staff ensure every learner is seen, heard, and supported.

# IB DP at ISR

## What is the IB DP?

We are proud to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB DP) for students in **Grades 11 and 12**. IB DP is a rigorous **two-year** pre-university course recognized worldwide for its excellence in preparing students for higher education and beyond.

### What is the IB Diploma Programme?

The IB DP is a comprehensive curriculum designed to develop students who are knowledgeable, inquiring, and compassionate. It encourages learners to think critically, engage in research, and understand the importance of intercultural awareness and communication. The programme culminates in examinations that assess students' mastery across various disciplines, leading to a qualification respected by universities globally.

### Curriculum Structure

Rooted in inquiry and global understanding, the programme gives students the freedom to explore their interests while developing strong academic and personal skills.

Each student selects one subject from six academic groups, ensuring both depth and breadth across disciplines.

### Why Choose the IB DP at ISR?

At ISR, we believe the IB DP offers unparalleled opportunities for academic and personal growth. The programme not only emphasizes intellectual rigor but also the development of skills essential for success in a global society. Our dedicated educators support students in becoming confident, ethical, and internationally minded individuals, prepared to excel in higher education and contribute positively to the world.



The DP is designed for motivated students aged 16 to 19 who are ready to engage deeply in academic work, take ownership of their learning, and grow as individuals. Students select **six subjects—three** at Higher Level (HL) and **three** at Standard Level (SL)—ensuring a well-rounded education with both depth and breadth.

**The DP Core** is what makes this programme truly unique.

Every student completes:

**1. Theory of Knowledge (TOK)**

Students explore how knowledge is constructed and question the ways we know what we know.

**2. Extended Essay (EE)**

A 4,000-word independent research project that develops advanced research and academic writing skills.

**3. Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)**

A personal project where students balance creativity, physical activity, and community service over the two years.

These three components encourage reflection, real-world engagement, and a deeper understanding of oneself as a learner.

# Forest School & Outdoor Education in the Primary Campus

### Unwinding, Playing, and Growing—After the School Day Ends

At ISR, care doesn't end with the final bell. Our Extended Day Programme (EDP) offers a warm, engaging space for our youngest learners to continue exploring, playing, and connecting—from **15:30 to 18:00** every school day.

Designed for students in **Pre-School through Grade 1**, the EDP begins with a nutritious afternoon snack, followed by participation in any scheduled After-School Activities (ASAs). Once those activities end, children transition into the Extended Day experience, which is conducted fully outdoors on our campus, encouraging movement, imagination, and meaningful social play.

Led by ISR staff who know and understand our youngest students, the programme is carefully designed to provide a balance of structure and freedom at the end of a busy day. Whether building, drawing, digging, or storytelling, children wind down in a joyful, natural environment.



# Afterschool Activities (ASA)

## Learning Without Limits

We offer a rich and diverse After-School Activities (**ASA**) program for students from Early Years to Grade 12, helping them develop artistic, social, and physical skills. Activities such as dance, football, and chess provide a fun, supervised space for students to explore their passions.

ISR students regularly participate in local and international field trips, enhancing their learning beyond the classroom.

Primary students engage in outdoor education with forest excursions, while older students take part in **World Scholars Cup** and **Model United Nations (MUN)** competitions, fostering global awareness and critical thinking.



## Primary School ASAs (Early Years – Grade 5)

At the Primary Campus, ASAs are all about joyful discovery and developing essential life skills through play, creativity, and movement.

Students can choose from a wide range of clubs, including:

- **Creative Arts:** jewelry making, mandala art, sewing, fantasy world building
- **STEM and Thinking Clubs:** math puzzles, computer club, chess
- **Sports & Movement:** football, basketball, dance, yoga, track & field
- **Languages & Culture:** Fun Latvian, book club, Latvian folk dancing
- **Social & Enrichment Activities:** All Star Kids Club, board games, storytelling

Activities vary by term and are designed to encourage collaboration, confidence, and imagination.

## Secondary School ASAs (Grades 6–12)

At the Secondary Campus, students dive deeper into their interests and take on leadership, performance, and service roles. Activities promote independence, global thinking, and personal growth.

Popular offerings include:

- Model United Nations (MUN)
- Student Council & Leadership
- Creative & Performing Arts: drama, music, visual arts
- Sports Teams: football, volleyball, basketball, track
- Academic Clubs: Science Club, Debate, French Film Club
- Service & Wellness: Mental health advocacy, CAS initiatives, yoga, volunteering



## How It Works

- ASAs run after school on school days, from **15:25** to **16:30**, offering students a fun and enriching way to end the day.
- Students can choose to participate in more than one ASA, depending on availability and scheduling.
- Activities typically run 1–2 times per week, with a rotating selection each term to reflect student interests and seasonal opportunities.
- Most ASAs are free of charge, though a few may have small material or instructor fees.
- Some clubs lead to performances, competitions, or exhibitions, giving students a chance to showcase their learning and creativity.

# School Bus Service



ISR offers a reliable **daily** bus service for students commuting to and from both campuses. Families can choose from several routes that cover key areas in and around Riga.

Students from **age 3 and up** are welcome to use the bus service.
